## STUDENT EXPECTATIONS

1. Have all appropriate classroom materials in class
a. instrument in working condition
b. reeds, mouthpiece, cork grease, valve oil, sticks, mallets, mutes, etc.
c. all music in your assigned music folder
d. a pencil
e. finger chart
f. scale sheet
2. a metronome and tuner (can be an app on your smartphone!)
3. Be respectful to classmates, visitors, equipment, and the director always.
4. If "it" is not yours, leave "it" alone! It does not matter if someone told you that you could borrow "it." Unless you own "it" or have an agreement with Mr. \& Mrs. Martin concerning "it", you are responsible for any damages to "it."
5. Be on time to all rehearsals and prepared to play all music. Being late to rehearsal or leaving rehearsal early will count as an unexcused absence from the entire rehearsal.
6. Do not bring any food, beverages, or gum in the band room *Exception: Water*


## GRADING AND ATTENDANCE POLICIES

The success of our program is in direct relationship to students' attendance, both physically and mentally, in-class and at all required after-school functions. Formative Assessments are tied to in-class activities, while Summative Assessments are tied required after-school functions \& playing tests.

In the event of an absence, a student may request an alternative assignment within $\mathbf{1}$ day of the student's return to school and can only request an absence once during a Nine Weeks' period. The alternative assignment will consist of recordings of the student's current repertoire.

## Parents \& Students: Band/Orchestra/Color Guard is a TEAM SPORT! <br> When one student is absent or quits, the ENTIRE TEAM is affected <br> \& will fall behind. You have made a commitment to your classmates <br> \& you need to follow through with that full-year commitment! <br> Please uphold your commitment!

Members of the Spruce Creek High School Instrumental Music Program are expected to place attendance at all band performances and rehearsals as equal, if not greater, priority to any other activities. An absence shall only be considered excused if the absence is due to personal or close family member's serious illness, accident, or death. These serious family emergencies will only be excused if the student's parent notifies Mr. \& Mrs. Martin of the emergency as soon as possible and a doctor's note will be required.

Marching Band \& Winter Guard: An absence from rehearsal, whether it is excused or unexcused, will result in losing the privilege to perform at half-time that week. If a student has more than TWO UNEXCUSED ABSENCES, the student will lose their spot on the field \& WILL RECEIVE AN F for the $1^{\text {st }}$ Nine Weeks.

Concert Bands \& Orchestra: An unexcused absence from rehearsal will result in a last-chair placement in the section. If a student has more than TWO UNEXCUSED ABSENCES WILL RECEIVE AN F FOR THE NINE WEEKS.

## Each week, student will be assigned:

20 Formative Assessments points per daily in-class rehearsal
25 Summative Assessment points for after school rehearsals
100 Summative Assessment points for performances
250 Summative Points for MPAs or Competitions
Up to 10 Points for Playing Assignments \& Tests

## Grade Deductions:

Unexcused Tardy for after-school rehearsal 15 pts
Absence (excused or unexcused) from after school rehearsal 25 pts
Unexcused Tardy for MPA/Competition/Performance 100 pts
Absence (excused or unexcused) from MPA or Competition 250 pts
Unexcused Tardy for daily in-class rehearsal 10 pts
No instrument in class 20 pts
No instrument for after-school rehearsal 20 pts
Missing music, but have instrument in-class 10 pts
Missing music, but have instrument after-school rehearsal 15 pts


## FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS

It costs a great deal of money to keep a high school instrumental music program running! Instrumental Music programs in Volusia County do not receive funding from Volusia County Schools and therefore, it is up to the students and parents of these programs to make sure all students are able to have a comprehensive musical education. Due to the large cost of running a program of this size, an annual fee is assessed to each student in program. ## INSTRUMENT RENTAL

Large instruments, unique instruments, and percussion instruments are owned by the Instrumental Music Program and rented to those students to which they are assigned. The Instrument Rental is $\$ 50.00$ per semester. We do not provide percussion sticks or mallets, mouthpieces, ligatures, or reeds. Repair amounts cannot possibly maintain and replace instruments as they wear out. Therefore, repairs to an instrument that breaks under a student's care will become their financial responsibility.


## FUNDRAISERS

Fundraising is a very important component of our program! Every year, it takes in excess of $\$ 175,000$ to run the Spruce Creek HS Instrumental Music Program. Since the program does not receive funding from the county or state, fundraising allows the program to keep the cost per student relatively low without sacrificing any of the programs we provide to every student.

Our fundraisers are split up into two categories: Individual Fundraisers which benefit an individual student and Group Fundraisers which help off-set the cost of the general costs of the program.

## Individual Fundraisers- Football Program Ads

Starting in May, families are encouraged to reach out to local businesses and ask for sponsorship, in exchange for advertisement in our Varsity Football Program, which is sold at all Varsity Football Games. While there is a list of businesses we have worked with in the past year, we are always open to new sponsors! Ads range in price from $\$ 50-\$ 1000$; Students will be able attribute $50 \%$ of the total amount of ads sold back to their account. The other $50 \%$ is used to produce and print the football program. There is no limit on the number of ads a student can sell!

## Group Fundraisers

Luminary Sales has been a cornerstone of the Spruce Creek High School Instrumental Music Program for the last 30+ years! During the first two Saturdays of December, our students \& parents canvas the Port Orange, South Daytona, Daytona Beach Shores, \& Ponce Inlet communities, selling luminary kits door-to-door. This past year, we raised over $\$ 30,000$, which will help to lower each students' fees this year by about $\$ 150$ !

Because this is such a large undertaking, all students AND parents in the Spruce Creek High School Instrumental Music program are REQUIRED to help with Luminary Sales, on both Saturdays and for the entirety of each day (8am-4pm)! Any student who does not attend the entire day will be charged $\$ 100$ per day missed- up to $\$ 200$ total. SAT \& ACT testing is not an excused activity \& students will still be charged a $\$ 100$ fee.


## ENSEMBLES



## High Steppin' Hawks Marching Band

This is the ensemble that gets the most exposure! The High Steppin' Hawks provides the band with a sense of unity, in that many individuals work and function together for a common goal.
The High Steppin' Hawks performs at all Spruce Creek High School home football games, all in-county away football games, play-off football games, two adjudicated events (including Marching MPA), and school and community events, such as parades and pep rallies. Everyone enrolled in a band program is a part of the Spruce Creek High School High Steppin’ Hawks! All students will be required to attend band camp in the summer, so that we can be prepared for our first football game of the year, which is the first week of school.

## Wind Ensemble

Wind Ensemble is a class that meets during the school day. In addition to meeting in class daily, Wind Ensemble will also meet every Tuesday from 3:45-5:45pm, November through April. Wind Ensemble will have quarterly performances, including FBA District 6 Concert Music Performance Assessment the first week in March and possible FBA State Concert Music Performance Assessment at the end of April. Students in the Wind Ensemble will be required to audition for the Volusia All County Band in November, play in an ensemble at FBA District 6 Solo \& Ensemble in February, and HIGHLY ENCOURAGED to play a solo at FBA District 6 Solo \& Ensemble.

## Symphonic Band

Symphonic Band is a class that meets during the school day. In addition to meeting in class daily, Symphonic Band will also meet every Thursday from 3:45-5:45pm, November through April. Symphonic Band will have quarterly performances, including FBA District 6 Concert Music Performance Assessment the first week in March and possible FBA State Concert Music Performance Assessment at the end of April. Students in the Symphonic Band are HIGHLY ENCOURGAED to audition for the Volusia All County Band in November and play a solo or ensemble at FBA District 6 Solo \& Ensemble in February.

## Concert Band

Concert Band is a class that meets during the school day. In addition to meeting in class daily, Concert Band will also meet every Thursday from 3:45-5:45pm, November through April. Concert Band will have quarterly performances, including FBA District 6 Concert Music

Performance Assessment the first week in March and possible FBA State Concert Music Performance Assessment at the end of April. Students in the Concert Band are HIGHLY ENCOURGAED to audition for the Volusia All County Band in November and play a solo or ensemble at FBA District 6 Solo \& Ensemble in February.


Orchestra
Orchestra is a class that meets during the school day. In addition to meeting in class daily, Orchestra will also meet after-school few times a year (please see calendar for those dates). Orchestra will have quarterly performances, including FOA District 6 Concert Music Performance Assessment in Late February. Students in the Orchestra will be required to audition for the Volusia All County Band in January, play in an ensemble at FOA District 6 Solo \& Ensemble in November, and HIGHLY ENCOURAGED to play a solo at FOA District 6 Solo \& Ensemble in November.

## 12 O' $^{\prime}$ Clock Jazz Band (10 ${ }^{\text {th }}-\mathbf{1 2}^{\text {th }}$ Grade)

The 12 O'clock Jazz band is a class that meets during the school day. The Jazz ensembles will have quarterly concert but will also have various gigs around the greater Port Orange area. Students in the 12 O'clock will be required to audition for the Volusia All County Jazz Band. This is an audition group. Auditions will be held at the end of each school year.

## $11 \mathbf{O}^{\prime}$ Clock Jazz Band (10 ${ }^{\text {th }}-\mathbf{1 2}^{\text {th }}$ Grade)

The 11 O'clock Jazz band is a class that meets during the school day. The Jazz ensembles will have quarterly concert but will also have various gigs around the greater Port Orange area. Students in the 11 O'clock will be encouraged to audition for the Volusia All County Jazz Band. This is an audition group. Auditions will be held at the end of each school year.


## Eurhythmics (Color Guard) (9 $\mathbf{9}^{\text {th }}-12^{\text {th }}$ Grade)

Eurhythmics is a class that meets $7^{\text {th }}$ Period during the school day. All students on the color guard are REQUIRED to be in the $7^{\text {th }}$ period class. In addition to meeting in class daily, Color Guard will also meet after school every Tuesday and Thursday for the entire year. The 1st Nine Weeks of the Color Guard class will be devoted to field guard (performing on the field with the marching band), while the $2^{\text {nd }}, 3^{\text {rd }}$, and $4^{\text {th }}$ Nine Weeks will be devoted to winter guard. All students enrolled in the color guard class are required to complete the full-year course, meaning they will be on field guard AND winter guard teams.


## AP Music Theory

AP Music Theory meets daily during $6^{\text {th }}$ period. AP Music Theory is a full-year course that meets every school day. Students in this class will master the necessary skills to earn a passing score on the AP Music Theory Exam. These skills are equivalent to a college level Theory I and Ear Training course.

At the conclusion of the AP Music Theory course, students will be able to:

- Define basic musical terms.
- Hear and notate pitches, rhythms, meters, intervals, scales, triads, and seventhchords.
- Listen to and describe (written and verbally) music from the Western tonal era aswell as jazz, contemporary styles, \& world music.
- Take melodic and harmonic dictation.
- Compose a bass line for a given melody, implying appropriate harmony.
- Realize Roman numeral progressions and realize figured bass
- Sing diatonic melodies at sight in both major and minor keys.
- Analyze and compose in four-voice texture.
- Identify and compose using small forms and cadences.
- Identify motive, phrase and period structure.
- Modulate to closely related keys.


## Pre-International Baccalaureate (IB) Music

All band, and orchestra students can participate in pre-IB music as their registered course. PreIB Music will give students IB/Honors level credits. Pre-IB music is available to all $9^{\text {th }}$ and $10^{\text {th }}$ grade students in the band program. The requirements to be in pre-IB Music are as follows:

- Payment of IB Music Fee
- Required to audition for All-County Band, All-County Jazz (If in a jazz class), All-County Orchestra
- Required to perform a solo at Solo and Ensemble Each February
- HIGHLY recommend that all students take two lessons a month with a professional on your instrument. *See directors for a list of recommended professionals*


## International Baccalaureate (IB) Music

All band, and orchestra students can participate in IB music as their registered course. IB Music will give students IB/Honors level credits. IB music is available to all $11^{\text {th }}$ and $12^{\text {th }}$ grade students in the band program. IB Music classes will meet during your regular scheduled class time. Two days a week students will meet in the IB portable and will work on IB music projects.
The requirements to be in IB Music are as follows:

- Payment of IB Music Fee
- Required to audition for All-County Band, All-County Jazz (If in a jazz class), All-County Orchestra
- Required to perform a solo at Solo and Ensemble Each February.
- HIGHLY recommend that all students take two lessons a month with a professional on your instrument. *See directors for a list of recommended professionals *


During Band Camp, morning rehearsals will be held outside, and afternoon rehearsals will be held inside. Please make sure you dress to be outside in the heat (loose-fitting clothing, athletic shoes and socks, hat, sunglasses, and sunscreen!), and drink a lot of water prior to rehearsal! Band camp is REQUIRED for all students enrolled in a band class, so family vacations NEED to be planned AROUND band camp.

## EQUIPMENT \& FACILITIES

1. "If my parents were watching, would I be doing this?"
2. For the security and safety reasons, the band room is off limits to students who are not enrolled in band, orchestra, or guard.
3. The band room is open by 8 am and available during lunch daily. Students may use the band room to practice or work on homework for other classes. Eating in the band room is prohibited.
4. There will be zero tolerance for horseplay (running, jumping, screaming, climbing, etc.) in the band room. Mr. \& Mrs. Martin will not be responsible for any injuries resulting in horseplay!
5. Any instrument or piece of equipment that does not belong to you is strictly off-limits. If you break it, you buy it! Instruments can cost anywhere \$200-over \$10,000.
6. Clean up after yourself! All chairs and stands must be put away after each rehearsal. Cases stay in lockers and book bags go against the walls.


## Instrument Lockers

Lockers and locks are assigned to students so they will have a place to safely keep their instruments. We have more students than lockers, so not everyone will be assigned a locker. Lockers will be assigned according to the size and type of instrument. Any lost lock will result in a $\$ 10.00$ charge. Volusia County Schools are not responsible for any lost or stolen personal items.

- Do NOT give your combination to another student
- Keep your locker always locked
- Students may NOT share lockers
- Food is NOT allowed in lockers
- Stickers, bumper stickers, pictures, etc., should not be placed on the outside of lockers


## Bulletin Boards \& White Boards

The bulletin boards and white boards must be checked daily for announcements and assignments. Besides Remind, this is the main method of communication between Mr. \& Mrs. Martin and students.

## Music \& The Music Library

Marching Music (stands tunes, warm-ups, scale sheets, halftime music, etc.) will be handed out during Kick Off. Extra copies of music are at the front of the classroom. Please contact a librarian if your specific part is not available.

Students will be issued a folder for concert \& jazz music. All music passed out in class must stay in that folder. Students are required to keep a pencil in their folder!

Music is very expensive, and it is expected that you take great care of it! If any music is lost or damaged, you will be responsible for the replacement cost. Music will cost $\$ 3.00$ per sheet.

## STUDENT LEADERSHIP



The Spruce Creek High School student leadership is appointed at the end of each school year by the directors. The students in these positions help to take care of day-to-day operations of the band. These students are expected to maintain the highest standards of musicianship, leadership, and personal behavior both during and outside of school. Leadership appointments are a yearlong commitment! The following officer positions may be available each year:

## Band Captain:

- Serves as role model on his/her instrument, and in attitude, behavior, and commitment to Spruce Creek High School.
- Must attend a summer leadership camp
- Presides as co-president of the Leadership Team, meaning they will run all weekly leadership meetings and be the liaison between Mr. \& Mrs. Martin and other leadership members.
These meetings will continue throughout the year.
- Responsible for organizing and coordinating stretch-block and assist in teaching drill and marching fundamentals during marching season.


## Color Guard Captain:

- Serves as role model on his/her instrument, and in attitude, behavior, and commitment to Spruce Creek High School.
- Must attend a summer leadership camp
- Presides as co-president of the Leadership Team, meaning they will run all weekly leadership meetings and be the liaison between Mr. \& Mrs. Martin and other leadership members.
These meetings will continue throughout the year.
- Assist with teaching marching fundamentals \& drill
- Responsible for scheduling and conducting sectionals on AT LEAST a bi-weekly basis.
- Communicates with Drum Majors regarding attendance at sectionals, practices, and games.
- Responsible for making sure each member in their section has their equipment at every sectional, rehearsal, and game; and that the equipment is in good working condition.
- Maintains momentum and enthusiasm during rehearses and performances.


## Orchestra President:

- Serves as role model on his/her instrument, and in attitude, behavior, and commitment to Spruce Creek High School.
- Highly encouraged to attend a music summer camp!
- Presides as co-president of the Leadership Team, meaning they will run all weekly leadership meetings and be the liaison between Mr. \& Mrs. Martin and other leadership members.
- Responsible for organizing sectionals \& social activities for Orchestra students.


## Drum Major:

- Conducts the marching band during halftime and stands tunes.
- Serves as role model on his/her instrument, and in attitude, behavior, and commitment to Spruce Creek High School.
- Must attend a summer leadership camp
- Presides as co-vice president of the Leadership Team, meaning they will run all weekly leadership meetings and be the liaison between Mr. \& Mrs. Martin and other leadership members. These meetings will continue throughout the year.
- Responsible for organizing and coordinating stretch-block and assist in teaching drill and marching fundamentals during marching season.
- Maintain accurate attendance records for each marching rehearsal.


## Orchestra Vice President

- Serves as role model on his/her instrument, and in attitude, behavior, and commitment to Spruce Creek High School.
- Highly encouraged to attend a music summer camp!
- Presides as co-vice president of the Leadership Team, meaning they will run all weekly leadership meetings and be the liaison between Mr. \& Mrs. Martin and other leadership members.
- Serves as the Orchestra Librarian


## Section Leaders \& Drum/Pit Captains:

- Serves as role model on his/her instrument, and in attitude, behavior, and commitment to Spruce Creek High School.
- Attends and actively participates in all officer meetings.
- Highly encouraged to attend a music summer camp!
- Assist with teaching marching fundamentals \& drill
- Responsible for scheduling and conducting sectionals on AT LEAST a bi-weekly basis.
- Reports to the Drum Majors regarding attendance at sectionals, practices, and games.
- Responsible for making sure each member in their section has their instrument/equipment at every sectional, rehearsal, and game; and that the instrument is in playing condition.
- Maintains momentum and enthusiasm during rehearses and performances.


## Quartermaster:

- Serves as role model on his/her instrument, and in attitude, behavior, and commitment to Spruce Creek High School.
- Attends and actively participates in all officer meetings.
- Highly encouraged to attend a music summer camp!
- Assists in fitting students for their uniforms at Kick Off.
- Responsible for uniform racks before and after the game.
- Assist students with properly caring \& maintaining for their marching and concert uniforms.
- Assist Ms. Davis in the care and upkeep of the Uniform Room


## Field Crew

- Serves as role model on his/her instrument, and in attitude, behavior, and commitment to Spruce Creek High School.
- Attends and actively participates in all officer meetings.
- Highly encouraged to attend a summer music camp!
- Maintains all marching equipment \& ensures it is on the field for every rehearsal and performance
- Assists in the maintenance of the field throughout the marching season
- Assists the Field Crew dads with the loading \& unloading of the trailer at away games and competitions
- Ensures that the stage is set up and torn down for each concert during that school year.


## Band Librarian:

- Serves as role model on his/her instrument, and in attitude, behavior, and commitment to Spruce Creek High School.
- Attends and actively participates in all officer meetings.
- Highly encouraged to attend a summer music camp!
- Maintains the band library, including Solo \& Ensemble music.
- Responsible for maintaining the extra parts at the front of the room.
- Responsible for copying parts for each ensemble.
